

Cranberries

Sun exposure: For best fruit production, plant in full sun.

Soil base of peat moss, sand, and bone meal to a depth of 6-

8." Does not like clay soil.

Water down the soil when preparing the bed for planting but

do not over-saturate or leave a puddle. Sow plants 2' apart to

Planting: accommodate runners generated during the first year of

growth. Providing this space will create a healthy plant bed

and good fruit production.

Fertilizing: Fertilize with a high nitrogen fertilizer in year one.

Watering: Water soil frequently until wet to the touch.

Plants will begin bearing fruit in the second or third year.

Harvesting: Harvest fruit in the fall, when the size of a small cherry and a

deep red color.
