

## Currants

Currants are great for the edges of your garden and will grow to an average height of 3-4' while requiring little pruning.

Sun exposure:	For good fruit production, place in full sun, but can tolerate some shade
Soil:	Can handle well-drained soil in a pH range of 5-8
Planting:	To produce fruit, currants must cross-pollinate. Plant at least two shrubs within a 3'-5' area. Can be planted any time of year, though most growth occurs in spring. Prepare hole to a depth and width of 12" and place the plant so the top roots are 2-3" below the soil line. Lightly mulch, leaving a 4" circle around the base of the plant
Watering:	Water when needed until plant is established, especially in drought conditions.
Harvesting:	Flowers appear in early spring, fruit ripens 70-100 days after bloom.
