

Gooseberries

Gooseberries may be the easiest berry plant to grow. Plants reach a mature size of 3-5' in width and height

Full sun but can handle shade Sun exposure: Thrives in less fertile soils Soil: Potted specimens can be planted as soon as soil thaws. Gooseberries are thorny, so allow for harvesting space **Planting:** between plants! Soil should not be compacted, loosen soil in a 2' radius for best results. Do not fertilize the first season though wood chips or mulch is OK. Plants can be fertilized in year 2 with manure or kelp **Fertilizing:** meal for best results. Do not tolerate standing water around their roots. Watering: Gooseberries are self-fertile, flowers in spring and fruit is Harvesting: ready to harvest in early summer Will become gangly and thin if not pruned. In the early years Winter care: prune dead branches, in later years prune out the thickest growth.
