

Wild Elderberry

Perennial shrub/tree can reach 12-15' or more. Prune annually.

| Sun exposure: | Full sun, but can tolerate partial sunlight |
|---------------|--|
| Soil: | Fertile soil with good drainage, pH 5.5-6.5 |
| Planting: | Prepare a planting site three-times the root ball size. Add any type of compost material to the hole. Do not compact the soil on top of the root ball, stake the tree and add a few inches of mulch. Do not mulch trunk |
| Fertilizing: | Fertilize with a 10-10-10 in early summer |
| Watering: | Shallow root system cannot tolerate standing water |
| Harvesting: | Berries begin to appear in late summer to early fall. Harvest when berries are a deep purple. Warning - berries are considered slightly toxic until cooked |
