

2016 Roses

Antique Roses, Old Garden Roses, and Older Classifications

Antique Roses include those classifications in existence prior to the first Hybrid Tea in 1867. They are known for their history, old-fashioned charm, fragrance, hardiness and vigor. Many are rebloomers, but a few have a very long single bloom period in early summer. These should be pruned after blooming, not before. Hybrid Musk roses are informally included among the Antiques, even though they did not arrive until 1897.

AUSTRIAN COPPER	4'	RED-ORANGE	R. foetida bicolor. "Turkish Rose," "Poppy Rose." Species, before 1590.	4
CARDINAL RICHELIEU	3-6'	PURPLE	Parmentier, Belgium, before 1847. This beautifully rich once-blooming rose is named after one of histories preeminent villains, featured in The Three Musketeers by Alexandre Dumas. Known also as The Red Eminence (L'Eminence Rouge), the Cardinal served as minister to Louis XIII From 1624 to 1642. The petal reverse is near white, producing a lovely and dramatic effect.	4b
DOORENBOS SELECTION	2-3'	RED	Hybrid spinosissima, pre-1820, the Netherlands. Deep magenta-red, single blooms in clusters with fluffy yellow stamens surrounding a yellow-green eye. Resembles a tiny, single tree peony bloom! Blooms once for several weeks in early summer. Own root.	4
DUCHESSE DE BRABANT	4-6'	PINK	Bernede, France, 1857. "Comtesse de Labarathe", "Comtesse Ouwaroff", "Countess Bertha", "Shell Rose" Long lasting fragrance and full cupped, repetitious blooms set this rose apart from the pack! This beauty was named for the Duke of Brabant of Belgium and was introduced in France over 150 years ago and looks like it could be plucked from an old painting. President Theodore Roosevelt made this rose his favorite, often wearing a blossom in his lapel.	5a
DUCHESSE DE ROHAN	4-5'	PINK	Lévêque & Fils, France, 1847. Deep pink blend with mauve tips as the bloom ages. The pointed buds open to large globular floret, changing to very full old-fashioned blooms. This recurrent historic bloomer can also be used as a container rose and is cold tolerant. The pleasant rich Centifolia fragrance is of strong old rose with fruity undertone reminiscent of berries.	4b
HARISON'S YELLOW	3-5'	YELLOW	Hybrid Foetida, Hybrid Spinosissima. Harison, USA, 1824. "Yellow Rose of Texas." This cross between two species roses is very hardy, disease resistant, and even a little shade tolerant. Light, pure yellow blooms in profusion in early summer. Small, dark green foliage. Nathan grows it on his rooftop deck. ARS rating 8.3.	3
LA SYLPHIDE	4	PINK	Joseph Boyau Père, France, 1842. "Mademoiselle Malton" This charming rose has a lovely strong tea fragrance. Double-petaled blooms return in delightful flushes throughout the season. Petals vary from light pink, to yellowish pink, to salmon-pink shading. Named after a famous French romantic ballet about a beautiful Sylph, (mythical spirit of the air) tragically enchanting a farmer on his wedding day. Requires winter protection.	6b
LOUIS PHILLIPPE	3-5'	RED	Guerin, France, 1834. "Florida Rose", "King of France", "Zavala Rose" A fragrant crimson beauty that like all old Chinas exhibits occasional white streaks. Emily de Zavala, wife of the Mexican minister to France, loved the roses at King Louis Philippe's court so much that when the Zavalas moved to Texas in 1835 to support the Texas Revolution she grew roses including 'Louis Philippe,' which became known as the "Zavala rose." Healthy, excellent repeater. Requires abundant winter protection! ARS 8.8.	7
MME JOSEPH SCHWARTZ	2-4'	CREAM	This rose is a sport of 'Duchesse de Brabant' and it's one of our favorite Teas. Prolific; blooms are exquisite and fragrant. Very disease resistant; healthy and clean. Propagated for Gethsemane by Nathan Beckner. Requires winter protection.	6b

MONSIEUR TILLIER	4-6'	DEEP PINK	Handsome and distinctive, this large, upright shrub bears flowers that are a mixture of pale rose, salmon and violet. Fully open blooms are compact and attractive, flat and very double. Its rich and unique fragrance is like a spicy herbal tea - very relaxing! Blooms in flushes throughout the season. Requires winter protection.	6b
MRS. B. R. CANT	4-5'	SILVER PINK	Cant, UK, 1901. Deliciously fat and sweet-smelling blooms arrive all summer long. Prolific but tender; requires winter protection. Better yet, keep it in a container, overwinter in garage or cold basement. This rose is worth the effort! Very disease resistant. Named for the wife of famous rose breeder and nurseryman, Benjamin Cant. ARS rating 8.9.	7
MYSTIC BEAUTY	3'	PALE PINK	Bourbon; Discovered by Patterson, 2001. Pale pink blooms, similar to Souvenir de la Malmaison. Gorgeous!	
ROSE DE RESCHT	3-4'	FUCHSIA	Portland; discovered by Nancy Lindsay, Iran, 1930. A favorite of ours for many years. Perfectly formed cushiony blooms of deep magenta are cloaked in bright green foliage. Strong, damask fragrance, tolerates some shade, and reblooms. It is said that this rose was discovered in the Persian (Iran) city of Rescht, and was brought to Europe in 1949. These roses are a great source for rose essential oil, which is used for rose perfume. Victoria grows it in her garden in a little shade. Wonderful! ARS rating 8.8.	4b
YOLANDE D'ARAGON	4'	MAUVE BLEND	Portland; Vibert, France, 1843. Very large, very fragrant blooms of rich mauve-pink. Give her a little time to settle in and she will reward you! Big June show followed by periodic repeat performances. Named for one of Joan of Arc's supporters, the wife of Louis II, Duke of Anjou. ARS rating 8.4.	4
LE HAVRE	4-6'	DEEP PINK	Hybrid Perpetual; Eude, France, 1871. Deep pink blooms, very tall plant, repeats in flushes all season.	6
Mme. ISAAC PEREIRE	6'	DEEP MAGENTA PINK	Bourbon; Garcon, France, 1881. A sumptuous rose of infinite charm. Large, very full flowers in a deep magenta-purple, with a strong perfume. Vigorous; may be trained to cover a trellis or obelisk. Repeats. ARS rating 8.4.	5
ULRICH BRUNNER FILS	5-8'	PINK DEEP	Antoine Levet, France, 1881. Its silky cerise blossoms fade quickly to rose and pink, releasing a good measure of delicious scent. Its nearly thornless canes can be quite long and vertical, so this is a good candidate for pegging. ARS 8.1. Requires winter protection.	6b
BALLERINA	3.5'	PALE PINK	Hybrid Musk, 1937. Sprays of 1" pink and white blooms cover this charming, airy shrub. Lovely with dark purple Clematis "jackmanii." ARS 8.8. Repeats.	5
BUFF BEAUTY	6'	APRICOT	Hybrid Musk; Bentall, UK, 1939. Rich honey colored blooms in profusion on a tall shrub that can be grown as a climber. Deeper color in cool weather, creamy in the height of summer heat. Repeats well, strong fragrance. ARS rating 8.2.	5
PERSIAN YELLOW	4-8'	DEEP YELLOW	Hybrid foetida, Iran, 1837. Golden yellow globe-shaped flowers grace this shrub for several dramatic weeks in early summer. Foliage is small and fernlike, fragrant. This rose is large and resents pruning; let it go for best results!	3a-9b
ROSA GLAUCA	7'	PINK	"Redleaf Rose." The highlight of this stunning rose is its deep purple, glaucous foliage with a bluish tinge. Sets clusters of urn-shaped hips that turn orange in the fall. Graceful vase shaped plant. Lovely with deep purple salvias. ARS 8.9. Own root.	2
ROSA NITIDA	4'	PINK	"Shining Rose." Once-blooming species rose, armed with prickles and full of gorgeous hips in the fall. Blooms are single, pink, and arrive in profusion in June.	

English Roses

This unofficial classification includes those roses hybridized by David Austin of Shropshire, England, one of the world's best-known and best-loved breeders. Beginning in the 1960's, Mr. Austin set out to cross antique roses with modern Floribundas and Hybrid Teas, combining modern color and vigor with old-fashioned faces and fragrance. Today his roses are among our most popular varieties. Check under "Climbers" for more Austin roses.

ABRAHAM DARBY	5'	APRICOT	1985. One of the best David Austin roses, a customer favorite for years. Old-fashioned face and fragrance, modern apricot color. Vigorous. Fred's favorite! ARS 8.0	5

AMBRIDGE ROSE	2-3'	APRICOT PINK	1990. Medium sized flowers that are nicely cupped at first, opening to form a loose rosette formation; their color being pure apricot, later paling towards the edges. It flowers freely and continuously on neat, busy growth, Suitable for the border and for bedding. ARS 8.2.	5b
BENJAMIN BRITTEN	4'	RED PINK	Indescribably luminous light red blooms in clusters on a tall, vigorous, healthy plant. Small, bright green and very glossy leaves. A very cute rose! Named for the popular mid-20th century English composer and musician.	5
BISHOP'S CASTLE	3-4'	PINK	2007. Clusters of blue-pink flowers, packed with more than 80 petals each. A very healthy rose that blooms like mad! Makes for great border planting or superb hedges. There is very good Old Rose fragrance. Named after Bishop's Castle, a small English border town whose castle is almost 1,000 years old! ARS rating 8.0.	5
BOSCOBEL	2-3'	PINK	2012. Perfectly formed, rich salmon rosettes that begin as red buds and eventually age to a rich, deep pink. A beautifully complex myrrh fragrance with hints of elderflower, pear and almond. Very healthy, with vigorous, upright, bushy growth.	5
BROTHER CADFAEL	4-6'	PINK	1990. Named after the fictional 12th century detective in a series of British historical murder mysteries. Very large blooms of medium pink, deeply cupped with incurving petals. Strong old rose fragrance. An excellent rose, one of Victoria's favorites. ARS 8.0	5
CARDING MILL	4'	APRICOT ORANGE	2004. Enchanting blooms open through a color range of orange, apricot, pink and yellow for a rich color play. Strong myrrh fragrance, very healthy. Named for a beautiful valley in the UK. ARS rating 8.3. Own Root.	5
CHARLES DARWIN	3'	YELLOW	2001. This delightful rose features huge flowers of softest buff yellow. Blooms are very fragrant with a hint of lemon and tea. Try it with deep pink perennials. Vigorous, bushy habit. Stunning!	5
CHARLOTTE	4'	YELLOW	1993. Rich yellow blooms fade to lemon, then cream at the edges, blooming singly or in clusters all summer long. Bright, light green foliage.	5
CLAIRE AUSTIN	4-6'	WHITE	2011. This newer introduction was named for David Austin's daughter. Nathan grew it on his rooftop deck with deep purple Clematis 'Polish Spirit.' Large, creamy white blooms grace a tall shrub that may be trained up a wall or fence. Strong myrrh scent touched with vanilla. Healthy and lovely.	6
CROCUS ROSE	3-4'	CREAM	2000. Tall, healthy shrub bursts with clusters of cream-colored blossoms that fade to white. Strong tea rose scent. Lights up the garden!	5
CROWN PRINCESS MARGA	4-5'	ORANGE	1991. A customer favorite! Warm apricot-yellow blooms, each packed with up to 120 petals! Tall and vigorous, may be grown as a climber. Stunning with deep purple salvia. Named for a granddaughter of Queen Victoria who loved to garden. ARS rating 8.3.	5
DARCEY BUSSELL	3-5'	RED PINK	Monferrato' 2005. Named after the highly acclaimed principal ballerina of the Royal Ballet. Clusters of very full, magenta-red blooms that age gracefully to dusky plum. Pleasing, fruity fragrance with hints of green. Own Root.	5
EGLANTYNE	4'	PALE PINK	1994. Named after the English founder of the charity "Save the Children." Highly regarded as one of the most beautiful of the English roses, and we agree. Deep pink buds open into pale pink shallow saucers, before opening fully to a domed shape. Old rose scent. Will accept some afternoon shade. Charming in every way!	5
EVELYN	3-4'	APRICOT	1992. We are helpless before this fabulous rose. Exquisite fragrance; large, long-lasting, fully double quartered blooms. Enchanting.	5
FAIR BIANCA	3-5'	WHITE	1982. This pure white rose resembles the beloved Damask rose, Madame Hardy. One of Oprah's favorite roses! Red-tinged buds open to pure white blooms with a tiny green eye and a very strong old rose fragrance. Relatively petite, worth trying in a container on a sunny deck or patio. Very sweet!	5b
FALSTAFF	3-4'	CRIMSON PURPLE	1999. Deepest crimson-purple blooms add drama to the garden. Powerfully perfumed with an Old Rose scent. Upright, bushy habit.	5
GERTRUDE JEKYLL	4-5'	PINK	1986. A classic David Austin rose, named for the legendary British garden designer and writer. Fat pine-scented buds open to old-fashioned quartered blooms, opening deep pink and fading slightly for a beautiful color tapestry. Quintessential old rose fragrance.	4
GOLDEN CELEBRATION	4-5'	YELLOW	1992. One of our favorites! Abundant golden apricot blooms atop bright light green foliage. Delicious tea scent with hints of strawberry. Nathan grows it as a glorious climber! ARS 8.1.	5

GRAHAM THOMAS	4-6'	YELLOW	1983. One of David Austin's best roses! Fragrant, buttery yellow blooms in profusion on a tall, very healthy shrub. Voted "World's Favorite Rose" by the World Federation of Rose Societies. Named for Austin's longtime friend, the famous British gardener and writer, who chose this rose to bear his name due to the remarkable color and rich tea scent. ARS rating 8.2.	5
HEATHCLIFF	3-5'	DEEP CRIMSON	2012. An intriguing newer variety named for the moody character in Emily Brontë's Wuthering Heights. Features very large blooms of a soft deep crimson. Unusual fragrance combining old rose and cedar. Its relatively petite size and excellent cold hardiness makes it an excellent addition to a Chicago garden.	4
HERITAGE	4-5'	PALE PINK	1984. Huge, blousy blooms glow pale pink on an upright shrub with relatively few thorns. The beautiful fragrance has overtones of fruit, honey and carnation on a myrrh background. Cool and refreshing. One of our very favorite Austins! ARS rating 8.3.	5
JAMES GALWAY	4-8'	WARM PINK	2000. A superb, large shrub with almost thornless growth. The color is a lovely warm pink at the center, shading to pale pink at the edges. This is a tough, disease-free rose that can be trained into a wonderful short climber. Medium old rose fragrance. It was named in celebration of the 60th birthday of James Galway, the world famous flautist.	6b
JUDE THE OBSCURE	3-4'	BUFF YELLOW	1995. Clusters of plump round buds of the warmest apricot open to buff yellow, very cupped blooms. Strong, exquisitely fruity fragrance with notes of citrus and guava. Named after Thomas Hardy's last novel from 1895, which tells the tragic tale of a common man with big dreams. ARS rating 8.0. Own root.	5
LADY EMMA HAMILTON	4'	ORANGE BLEND	2005. Coppery orange, deeply cupped blooms are set off by gorgeous bronzy foliage. Fragrance is strong and fruity. Named for the 18th century British socialite who was most famous for being Admiral Horatio Lord Nelson's illicit lover. ARS 8.0. Stunning!	5
LADY OF SHALOTT	3-4'	ORANGE COPPER	2009. Named after a famous poem by Alfred, Lord Tennyson to celebrate the 200th anniversary of his birth. Dozens of medium sized, cupped blooms in luminous orange grace this plant in flushes all summer. Strong fragrance of apple, clove and tea. Hardy, clean and disease resistant.	5
LD. BRAITHWAITE	4'	CRIMSON	1988. The intense crimson color of this rose is nearly unbelievable! The fragrance starts light, but intensifies as the plant ages. Growth habit is somewhat sprawling. A very cold-hardy variety well suited to northern gardens. One of Victoria's favorites!	4
LICHFIELD ANGEL	3-4'	CREAM	2006. A prolific bloomer! Deeply cupped, pale apricot buds open fully to creamy dome-shaped blooms. Sweet spicy scent. Named for an 8th century sculpted panel recently discovered in a cathedral near David Austin's UK nursery.	6
MARY ROSE	3-4'	PINK	1983. A fantastic plant in every way! A vigorous bloomer, it covers itself in blousy, fragrant flowers of pure pink, repeating early and often. Rich old rose fragrance with hints of honey. Healthy and cold-hardy too! Our dear friend Mary grows it in a container on her balcony. ARS rating 8.3.	4
MUNSTEAD WOOD	2-3'	PURPLE	2007. Light crimson buds open to a dramatic velvety deep crimson purple. New foliage reddish bronze, changing to mid green. Growth is bushy. Small stature works well for city gardens and containers. Very fragrant!	5
OLIVIA ROSE AUSTIN	3'	SOFT PINK	2005. This rose was named after the daughter of David Austin Junior, and Austin considers it one of the best roses they've ever bred! Blooms have a strong, pleasing fragrance with distinct fruity tints. The growth is vigorous and it repeat-flowers well. It is also one of the most disease-resistant Austin roses.	5a
OTHELLO	4-6'	CRIMSON	1986. Very large, fragrant blooms of a sumptuous dark purple-red. Very vigorous and thorny, can be trained on a wall or trellis, but do so when the canes are young and relatively pliable. May appreciate a little afternoon shade. Named for the heartbreakingly tragic title character from the 1604 Shakespeare play.	5b
PRINCESS ALEXANDRA OF KENT	3'	PINK	2007. A few rows of soft pink outer petals encase the deeply cupped, rich pink center of each bloom for a lovely color play. Up to 130 petals per bloom! This rose won the fragrance award at the 2009 Glasgow, Scotland rose trials.	5
QUEEN OF SWEDEN	3-4'	LIGHT APRICOT-PINK	2005. Fat, apricot buds open to shallow, quartered cups. Blooms fade gently to soft pink as they age. Warm old rose fragrance with a touch of myrrh. Blooms resist rain and weather!	5
ROSE-MARIE	3-4'	WHITE	White Heritage.' 2003. This is the nearly white sport of one of our very favorite roses, "Heritage." She shares all of Heritage's good qualities, including nearly thornless canes. Pretty blooms with the sweet fragrance of honey and almonds appear in flushes all summer long. Very lovely!	5

SCEPTER'D ISLE	3-4'	PINK	1997. Fat, crimson buds open to soft pink blooms with lighter pink outer petals, golden stamens. A very generous bloomer. Strong myrrh fragrance. Extremely cold-hardy. A very sweet disposition! ARS rating 8.1.	4
SHARIFA ASMA	3-4'	PINK SOFT	1989. This near-continuous bloomer is loaded with charm. Cupped blooms are of a delicate blush pink with a hint of yellow at the center, paler petals towards the outside. Fruity fragrance. Extremely cold-hardy.	4
ST. SWITHUN	4-6'	PINK SOFT	1983. Very large, soft pink blooms, with many petals arranged around a perfect button eye. Large and vigorous, may be trained as a small climber or used at the back of the border. Strong myrrh fragrance. Healthy and reliable!	5
TAMORA	3-4'	APRICOT	1983. This stunning rose is closely related to the old Gloire de Dijon and it has inherited both its lovely glistening apricot color and its delicious fragrance of lilac and mimosa. Named after Shakespeare's blood-lusty Amazon Queen from 'Titus Andronicus'. One of our favorite Austin blooms!	5b
TEASING GEORGIA	4-6'	YELLOW	Perfectly formed rosettes of rich deep yellow, fading to creamy yellow toward the outer petals as the blooms age. Graceful arching growth, can be trained as a short climber. Try it paired with a deep purple clematis for a dramatic color play.	5
TESS OF THE D'URBERVILLES	4-6'	RED	Austin, UK, 1998. Very large, deep crimson flowers with strong old rose scent. Upright, vigorous plant; may be grown as a climber. Named for the title character from Thomas Hardy's 1891 novel. Truly stunning! ARS rating 8.0.	5
THE DARK LADY	3'	MAGENTA RED	1991. Rich, velvety blooms of deepest magenta red. Rugosa ancestry makes it hardy and healthy. Victoria has grown it for years. Lovely!	5
THE PILGRIM	4-6'	YELLOW LIGHT	Bright cool yellow blooms have a fantastic unusual scent reminiscent of firewood or tobacco. May be grown as a climber. Blooms light up an evening garden.	5
THE POET'S WIFE	4'	YELLOW	2014, The lemon fragrance is strong and becomes sweeter and strong with age. Blooms hold their vibrant yellow color very well. This is the first yellow rose that Austin has introduced in over a decade, but this remarkable rose was worth the wait!	5
TRANQUILITY	3-4'	WHITE	2014. Fat, round, red-tinged buds open to pale creamy yellow blooms that age to white, with a very mild apple fragrance. Upright, arching habit with very few thorns. Very lush and floriferous.	5
WINCHESTER CATHEDRAL	3-4'	WHITE	1984. Produces masses of fragrant blooms throughout the summer. Attractive, loose-petalled, white flowers. Delicious Old Rose fragrance with hints of honey and almond blossom. Very free-flowering. Named after the Church of England's Gothiccathedral in Winchester, one of the largest cathedrals in England.	5b
WINDERMERE	2-3'	CREAM	2007. Gorgeous cream colored blooms, full and cupped, with a luscious lemony citrus fragrance. Compact, bushy habit works well in smaller gardens. Fewer thorns than other roses. Named after the largest lake in England. One of Victoria's favorites.	5
WISLEY 2008	4'	SOFT PINK	2008. A rose of exceptional delicacy and charm with soft pink, shallowly cupped rosettes. Nicely complemented by the medium green, semi-glossy foliage. Delightful, fresh, fruity fragrance with hints of raspberries and tea. Named for the famous RHS Gardens at Wisley, where many English Roses are planted.	5
YOUNG LYCIDAS	3.5	PURPLE MAGENTA	2008. This beauty has classic Old Rose blooms and a lovely fragrance that combines tea and old rose with hints of cedar wood. Named to mark the 400th anniversary of the birth of the poet John Milton. 'Lycidas' eulogizes a drowned friend and is considered one of the finest short poems in the English language. Interestingly, it was Milton who introduced the word 'fragrance' into the English language!	5

Climbing Roses

Climbing roses have long canes that are flexible when new, allowing them to be trained on a wall, fence, arbor, or other garden feature. Climbers bloom their best when trained out and up. They need not be heavily pruned; remove deadwood, trim back longest canes by 12" or so, and cut back lateral side shoots to 6-8". Ramblers are extremely vigorous, reaching 15'-30', and are suitable for covering large areas.

AUTUMN SUNSET	8-10'	YELLOW	Lowe, USA, 1986 Large, very fragrant, butter-yellow blooms open from festive orange buds on a hardy and super disease resistant climber. A sport of 'Westerland,' one of our favorite climbers. A staff favorite every year! ARS rating 8.1.	5
BLAZE, Improved	9-14'	SCARLET RED	1950. Deep red flowers open all at once, spreading like a fire of color on gates, walls and trellis. Blooms peak in June and early fall, but continue to repeat throughout the summer. One of the best red climbers ever. An All-American favorite! ARS rating 8.9. Weeks O.R.	5
CL. ICEBERG	15'	WHITE	"Fée des Neiges" Cants, UK, 1968. Rugged white climber, beautiful and fragrant. Spectacular once it's established. A classic! ARS rating 8.9.	5
CLAIRE AUSTIN	6'	WHITE	2011. This gorgeous climber was named for David Austin's daughter. Large, creamy white blooms grace a tall shrub that may be trained up a wall or fence. Strong myrrh scent touched with vanilla. Healthy and lovely, stunning in Nathan's garden with clematis 'Polish Spirit.'	6
CLOUD 10	7-8'	WHITE	Radler, USA, 2013. A gorgeous white climber from the breeder of 'Knock Out' roses. It has exceptionally clean, disease resistant foliage and lovely fat blooms. Very nice for an evening garden!	5
CONSTANCE SPRY	6'	PINK	Austin, UK, 1961. The first of David Austin's English rose series, famously grown at Montisfont Abbey. Floribunda Roses

Floribundas share the elegant flower form of the Hybrid Tea with the vigorous cluster-flowering habit of the polyantha roses. They originated in 1909 with 'Gruss An Aachen'. Floribundas are upright and bushy in habit, cloaked almost continuously in clusters of blooms. Prune floribundas severely in early spring, as you would a Hybrid Tea. Deadhead regularly to promote continuous bloom.

These roses are heavy feeders and require good winter protection and preventative measures against disease. Prune hard in early spring, reducing the plant to five or fewer sturdy canes under 12". While the effort may be daunting, Hybrid Teas reward the hardworking gardener with some of the most spectacular blooms of any garden plant!
